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Introduction-

Saru Chandra village is the place where the 106 No. Chandra Primary School is located. The school and the four Wards are connected. The four Ward are -College of Educator

1. Saru chandra

- 2. Maju Chandra
- 3. Barchandra

4. Chandra Grant

For all four of these wards, Chandra Primary School, number 106, has been created. People in this community believe that as the land was desolate (5794)) for a long period of time that's why the name of the village was named as Chandra.

The Chandra village is located in north of Guwahati which is the nearest town for all major economic activities and approximately 25 km away. The people of this village can use road transport, water transport and ropeway for traveling. The village is nearest to Guwahati city but still free from chaos.

The settlement is encircled by the Mandakata Commando Center to the north, the Phulung Sub-Health Center to the south, Dalbari Pathar and AIMS Medical to the west, and Dirgheshwari Hills (Sitachal Hills) to the east.

1. Saru Chandra:- The 106 no. Chandra Primary Schools is located in this ward. A small medical center is also present. This ward is home to a large number of residences from many communities, such as Thakuria, Das, Goswami, Sarania and Nepalis. 10% of the village inhabitants is employed by the government, 30% runs their own businesses, 20% works for the private sector, and the remaining 50% earn a living as wage earners and farmers. From an educational perspective, there are relatively few educated persons as a percentage of the total population. Individuals who have completed their schooling are now seeking further education.

2. Maju Chandra- The locality of Maju Chandra is basically covered by Rabha and Boro people. Out of 500 people only two Brahmin families live with them peacefully. The educational qualification of the villages of Maju Chandra ward is quite average with one Anganwadi Centre. According to available data, 20% of the population works for the government, 15% for the private sector, and 35% owns their own business. The remaining 30% earn a living as wage earners and farmers.

3. Bar Chandra- .The locality of Maju Chandra is basically covered by Das community's people. Merely out of which 10% of the population is employed by the government, 25% is in business, 25% is in the private sector, and the remaining 40% are comprised up of wage workers and farmers. This village is developed in the educational field.


4. Chandra Grant: Different communities Das, Boro, Kowar, Nepali, and Brahmin are living in this ward peacefully without engaging in agricultural field. Half percent of the total population are engaged in private sector nearby locality as well as metro city. There are 150 people living in this community. While out of which 20% of individuals work in business, 30% of people are employed by the government, and the remaining 50% are employed by the private sector. Dr. Gitanjal' Choudnury


